

2008 JVFL PEE-WEE SUPER BOWL

REEDSVILLE- Defense was the name of the game November 1st as the State College Little Lions and the Kish Indians faced off in the PEE WEE Juniata Valley Super Bowl at the IV Middle School.

After losing to the Little Lions early in the season, the Little Indians evened the score when it counted, shutting them out 12-0. Both defenses took center stage early on as both refused to give ground as each team attempted fourth down situations, leaving the first quarter scoreless.

After holding State College on a second consecutive 4th down, the defense handed the ball back to its offense. And this time the offense was ready. Kish opened with the ball at the State College 41, from there they grinded out a 12-play scoring drive on the running of Ryan Walker, Cole Peachey and Isaac Maclay.

With only 18 seconds left on the clock, Maclay put his team on the board as he muscled his way in for a 1-yard touchdown run. From there the tenacious Kish defense took over keeping the potent State College running game in check and coming up with big plays. Facing a 4 and 5, the Lions gambled at midfield and went to the air where Brandon Fultz intercepted it at the Indians 32. The Indians used that momentum and went on its second and final scoring drive of the game. This time it took Kish only 10 plays to find their way to the end zone as Fultz got the call from 4 yards out, giving the Indians the insurance they needed.

The defense took back over from there en route to the 12-0 shut out. Both teams finished with records of 10-1.
